The regularly scheduled meeting of Newbury Township Trustee called to order at 7:00 p.m., October 16, 2019, with Bill Skomrock and Greg Tropf present.

Mr. Skomrock asked Doug to take care of the E check for the pickups if they are needed. Mr. Skomrock asked Mr. Zimperman and Mr. Tim Mansfield to attend they special training event on November 6, 2019 about safety.

Ms. Mansfield requested the approval of financials for September 2019. Motion to approve financial made by Mr. Tropf 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mr. Skomrock and a unanimous affirmative vote by all.

Ms. Mansfield requested the approval of minutes from regular meeting October 2, 2019. Motion to approve minutes was made by Mr. Tropf 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mr. Skomrock and a unanimous affirmative vote by all.

Mr. Mansfield reported new lights for Vet Parks, they are trying to get the lights to hold a white color instead of changing color all the time.

Mr. Tropf reported that Milano has started working on the cemetery repairs. Motion to set fees for use of Oberland, Vets Park and Town hall at \$50.00 refundable for residents and non-refundable for non-residents was made by Mr. Tropf, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mr. Skomrock and a unanimous affirmative vote by all. Mr. Tropf also discussed the recycle bins, he indicated that we should consider getting rid of them so there is not garbage blowing around and misuse. The recycle bins have been a problem for a while, with people putting garbage in and around the bins, requiring constant cleanup and monitoring by the township. The Trustees will check with the county to see if they are still planning on opening a center recycle center and then make a decision on what to do.

Mr. Skomrock discussed the Miller Dodson report that we received, he would like a separate meeting to discuss the report. He reported for NOPEC and who would be the county representative. Mr. Koons will be the rep for the county. NOPEC will hold a meeting in November to discuss NOPEC information including grants available in 2021. Mr. Skomrock discussed the bonds required or a faithful performance of duty insurance policy, we can pick either one. Motion to accept Resolution 20191016-01 per ORC 3.061 the township is adopting this resolution to allow the use of an "employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty" coverage document, rather than a surety bond, to cover loss by fraudulent or dishonest actions of employees and failure of employees to faithfully perform duties. Motion by Mr. Tropf, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mr. Skomrock and a unanimous affirmative vote by all.

Mr. Skomrock reported that the scrap tire grant has been completed. He also reported that the township will no longer have to report our year-end inventory to the county. He discussed a class action lawsuit against the opioid manufacturers. No action was taken, we will remain with the class action group. He indicated that we are retaining a private lawyer for the Rec Board decision.
